

FARM FACT

Beef Cattle - Grass Tetany Hypomagnesaemia

Grass tetany is one of the commonest causes of death in southern Australian cattle in late winter and early spring. It is a nervous disorder of cattle associated with a low level of magnesium in the soil and the blood which causes increased excitability, muscle spasms and death. The use of nitrogen and potassium fertilizers in short-rotation rye grass pastures and fodder crops increases the risk of grass tetany especially in young and lush pastures.

Symptoms: An affected cow staggers, becomes aggressive may throw her head around and develops a stiffness of the limbs, grinds her teeth, has muscle tremors and shivering and convulsions, followed by collapse, violent paddling of the feet and death. Severe cases can die with few signs. There are no post mortem signs so grass tetany is usually diagnosed by history, symptoms and low Magnesium levels in the aqueous humour of the eye.

Treatment: Lick blocks fortified with magnesium, calcium and molasses are commonly fed out in the grass tetany season. Magnesium Oxide sprayed on hay is a more reliable method as are ruminal magnesium pellets.
