# FIREWOOD COLLECTION INFORMATION

Autumn 2014 firewood collection season is currently open until the 30th of June 2014.

Firewood collection areas are published on the Department of Environment and Primary Industries Website or from the local DEPI office in Bendoc.

Firewood collection on Public land is now more affordable and straightforward for the community. Collection of firewood for domestic use from State forest (and those parks where collection is allowed) no longer requires a permit.

Season and collection areas apply to safeguard our forest and parks and mitigate safety risks.

Collection is only allowed in designated domestic firewood collection areas. These are clearly marked by signs. Rules apply when collecting domestic firewood.

Collection areas are located where possible, to avoid sites of environmental and cultural significance and to make use of the by-products of activities such as commercial timber harvesting and road construction. Domestic firewood collection is not permitted within Vic forest advising that they are unavailable to the public.

Firewood collection is only allowed in the autumn season (1 March—30 June) and the spring season (1 September—30 November).

If there is a fire danger risk before 30 November the relevant firewood collection season may be shortened.

The seasons are consistent across the state and aim to minimise risks to people, the environment and infrastructure by avoiding firewood collection during winter and during the highest fire hazard periods.




## Words of Wisdom

Thanks Kay for sharing this walk down memory lane.
















## Recipe Of The Month

Roast Pumpkin Soup

1 tbsp Dijon mustard 2 tbsp honey

2 kg butternut or sweet pumpkin cut into cut into thin wedges, skin on 7 cups chicken or vegetable stock Sea salt and cracked black pepper

Preheat the oven to 200C. Place the pumpkin in a baking dish and bake for 45-55 minutes or until soft and golden.

Scrape the pumpkin from the skin. Place the flesh in a blender in two batches with 1 cup of the stock in each batch and blend until smooth.

Place the pumpkin puree, remaining stock, mustard, honey, salt and pepper in a saucepan and simmer over medium heat for 5 minutes.

Serve in bowls topped with flavoured sour cream or shaved gruyere cheese.
