Not happy: theft of table from popular picnic spot angers residents

Local residents in the Tubbut-Bonang area were disgusted to find that a picnic table and benches recently erected by the Shire of East Gippsland were stolen over the Australia Day long weekend.

Residents have been asking for better facilities at this popular site on the Jingallala River for years. Discussions with a shire officer who has developed good relationships with local people led to the installation of the table last year.

The shire maintains the Dellicknora Road and thus has an interest in the site. The Dellicknora Road itself exists only because an active group of local people lobbied the Orbost Shire Council to turn the local track into a two-wheel drive road in the 1950s, cutting off more than 10k from Tubbut peoples' trip to town (Delegate).

Deb Foskey, coordinator of Tubbut Neighbourhood House, said that locals were hopeful the table would be returned.

"You don't get away with much around here, there's always someone looking," she said.

Sandy Cameron, who worked hard to secure the table, was devastated by the theft.

"Don't they know that we have to work for everything we've got around here?" she asked.

"Workers stop there for their lunch and tourists like the spot with its table and nearby stream. Now they can't even boil the billy because someone stole the barbecue before Christmas."

Someone liked the spot so much that his family have placed his ashes there. No-one knows the story, but the plaque shows this has long been a favourite spot for visitors.

It deserves a table and residents appeal to the thief to bring it back.



Recipe of the Month: Vietnamese Chicken and Noodle Bowl

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/4 cup Oyster Sauce
- 1 TBS Brown Sugar
- 1 TSP Sesame Oil
- 8 Chicken Thigh Fillets
- 200g Vermicelli Rice Noodles
- 2 TBS Lime Juice
- 1 large Carrot cut into matchsticks
- 1 small Red Onion cut into wedges
- 1 Red Chilli sliced
- 1/2 cup Mint Leaves
- 2 TBS Peanuts chopped
- Sweet Chilli Sauce & Lime Wedges to serve



METHOD:

1. Pre heat oven to 220C. Line a large baking tray with baking paper.
2. Combine oyster sauce, sugar, 1 TBS water, oil and chicken in a large bowl. Place on the prepared tray. Bake, brushing with any tray juices, for 20 mins or until browned and cooked through. Set aside for 5 mins to rest. Thickly slice.
3. Meanwhile, place the noodles in a heatproof bowl and cover with boiling water, stand for 5 mins to soften. Rinse under cold water. Drain. Toss with lime juice.
4. Divide the noodles among serving bowls. Top with the chicken, carrot, onion, chilli, mint and peanuts. Serve with sweet chilli sauce and lime wedges.

Agri News

EID/RFID 's now Mandatory for Sheep and Goats.

Sheep and Goats born in Victoria after January 1st 2017 are now required to be tagged with an EID.

The Victorian government has committed 17million in subsidies to try to help soften the blow when purchasing tags for producers.

Until recently the average tag cost was 77 cents but with the aide of the package they will now be reduced to 35 cents per tag.

With traceability being a crucial part of livestock production, processing and consumption, it will be interesting to see how effective this is. Ed Note.

2017

JANUARY 1
All sheep and goats born in Victoria must be electronically tagged before leaving property.

JULY 1
Scanning of sheep and goats starts in saleyards, abattoirs and knackeries.

DECEMBER 31
Sheep and goats must be scanned in abattoirs.

2018

MARCH 31
All sheep and goats must be scanned in saleyards.
Sheep and goats moving property to property must be scanned.

2019

JANUARY 1
Sheep and goats introduced from interstate and born after 1 January 2017 must be electronically tagged before leaving a Victorian property.

2022

JANUARY 1
All sheep and goats regardless of age must be electronically tagged before leaving their property.
