Background:

Yeoval, NSW. Along with their management team they operate three enterprises; commercial Merinos, a Kerin Poll Merino stud, and a trade sheep and cattle operation. They still crop, but the yield stays on farm as feed for the livestock. One of the main realisations for the Kerin's was that their greatest profit driver is their pasture, and not so much their stock. Today, Nigel always has 128 days of grass in front of his stock. When rain does arrive, the Kerin's are in position to have both grass, and money, to buy stock at lower prices. Nigel believes that 'whenever you have got grass, you 've got options; while whenever you 've got options, you 've got a life'.



Saturday 18th Feb:

Delegate Pony Club invited specialised instructor Peter Gillis to come and conduct private lessons for riders within Zone 18.

Saturday kicked off very early and Peter ran 15 private lessons and one group lesson. He focused on control, technique and jumping.

Peter is a Cross Country course designer.

Delegate Pony Club has put forward a submission for a local cross country riding area and with the possibility for the future to hold one day events.

Many of the riders and parents camped overnight at Delegate ready for a special rally day on Sunday. Delegate Pony Club members were very impressed and happy to take advantage of the new undercover grandstand area at Delegate Show ground.

Sunday 19th Feb-Special Rally Day:

There was one early lesson conducted by Peter Gillis.

First thing for the 23 riders was a briefing and then they were split into groups of riding ability. There were 4 groups and 4 different activities each group had an hour before rotation. Peter Gillis ran the riders through techniques using rhythm, pace, control and jumping. Delegate Pony Club appreciated Peter travelling so far and conducting a great couple of days. He also spoke to the riders at the end of the day and gave them feedback and a few specialised pointers. Rowena Butterworth ran an unmounted session using bailing twine and blind folds. This session showed the riders what their horse feels like when you are riding them. It was all about steering and control. One rider was the horse (blind folded) the other was the rider. Another group ran by Gail Smallman worked on riding and lead classes, with the up and coming shows it was a great opportunity to take advantage of a local who has plenty of experience in this field.

Nadean White took a group and ran them through braiding and plaiting for showing. All the riders learnt so much and had fun learning.

Delegate Pony Club had 2 new sign ups on the day. The youngest rider signed up yesterday on her 2nd birthday, little Myah Voveris loves her pony Lolly and loved that she can officially be part of Delegate Pony Club.

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Recipe of the Month: Asian Beef Mince Noodle Bowl

INGREDIENTS:

- 500g beef mince
- 2 tbsp veg oil
- 1/2 cup of hoisin sauce
- 1/2 520g bag asian style coleslaw mix
- Noodles of choice, prepared following packet



***You can get the Asian coleslaw at most supermarkets

METHOD:

- 1. Heat 1 tbsp oil in a frying pan or wok over medium heat. Add mince and cook for 5 minutes, breaking it up with a wooden spoon, until browned.
- 2. Add hoisin sauce. Stir well until combined. Add coleslaw mix and 1 tbsp of water and toss until well combined. Cook for 1 minute or until vegetables are just tender.
- 3. Meanwhile, heat remaining oil in a large frying pan. Fry eggs for 2-3 minutes or until whites are cooked. Spoon mince mixture over noodles. Place an egg over mince, sprinkle with chilli and green onions. Serve with steamed asian greens.
