Recipe of the Month: Chocolate Fudge Tunnel Cake

Mix together —1 cup of oil
2 eggs
1 cup of sugar

Add—1 cup of hot coffee;
1 cup of buttermilk (milk & lemon juice)
3 cups of S/R flour
1 teaspoon of vanilla essence
Spoon 3/4 of the mixture into an oiled ring tin.

Filling
Mix— 1 egg
1/4 cup of sugar
8 oz cream cheese (227 gms)
1/2 cup chocolate bits

Spoon filling onto cake mixture in tin, then cover with remaining cake mixture.
Bake in a moderate oven for 1 hour — cover with brown paper to reduce browning.

If in doubt check if requests or offers are genuine by looking up phone numbers in independent directories or contacting Consumer Affairs Victoria or SCAMwatch service.
