Recipe of the month.

Rosemary and Garlic Chops

Ingredients.

2 Tablespoons Orange Juice

2 tablespoons Italian Red Wine Vinegar.

2 cloves garlic, crushed

2 teaspoons rosemary, finely chopped

1/4 cup olive oil

8 Lamb Loin Chops

2 zucchini, sliced diagonally

2 red capsicums, cut into thick strips

250g cherry tomatoes

60g mixed salad leaves, to serve

Method

Step 1 Preheat barbecue grill or chargrill on medium-high. Combine the orange juice, vinegar, garlic, rosemary and half of the oil in A shallow glass or ceramic dish. Add lamb Chops and turn to coat. Set aside for 10 mins to marinate.

Step 2 Meanwhile, combine the vegetables and remaining oil in a bowl. Cook, turning, for 8 minutes or until tender and brown. Transfer to a plate.

Step 3.

Cook Lamb chops on grill for 3 minutes each side for medium or until cooked to you liking. Season. Serve with vegetables and salad leaves

Fighting fires together across state borders

Bushfires don't respect boundaries and fires that start close to the Victorian-New South Wales border in the far east of our region have potential to threaten communities, infrastructure and assets in both states.

A long-running cross-border agreement between emergency response agencies addresses the issues and complexities of the management of cross-border fires.

Forest Fire Management Victoria Assistant Chief Fire Officer, Chris Stephenson said: "Our state agencies have been collaborating for more than 20 years on a formal agreement to ensure a rapid and effective response to any bushfires close to the state border."

"We met in Lakes Entrance on the 18th of October to review, update and further strengthen our agreement and to prepare ourselves and our systems for the season ahead," Mr Stephenson said.

"The member agencies involved in the cross-border firefighting arrangements include NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service, Forestry Corporation of NSW, NSW Rural Fire Service, NSW Police, Forest Fire Management Victoria, Victorian CFA and Victoria Police."

"We have a strong level of communication and willingness to work co-operatively through resource sharing arrangements, highlighting the value of these cross-border arrangements."

CFA Assistant Chief Officer, Trevor Owen said: "It's critical that our fire agencies work together to protect communities, regardless of borders and boundaries."

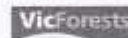
"Our agencies rely heavily on our people and their relationships. It's essential for the safety of all Australians that we can work together with a common goal."

"Each agency can provide a range of specialist skills with an array of resources which, when combined can provide communities near the NSW-Victorian border with a bigger range of firefighting resources to meet our day-to-day fire demands."

"Liaison across the border and between agencies is robust, and the established cooperation and collaboration across an area of mutual interest will ensure a rapid and effective response to any bushfires that might threaten lives and property close to the state border and beyond."

Forest Fire Management Victoria consists of specialist staff drawn from the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning, Parks Victoria, Melbourne Water and VicForests. These staff work alongside CFA, other emergency services and communities across Victoria to protect people, property and the environment.

- Riders must be financial members of PCANSW – yellow rally card attendance & membership cards **MUST** be presented at registration on the day of the Gymkhana.
- In events involving jumps – rails will be placed on the ground for Led riders as Led riders are not permitted to go over raised poles.
- Led Riders must be led by the horses shoulder. Riders in the Led/Assisted group can interchange between on & off the lead throughout the day but must remain in the same group.
- Riders must have attended 3 rallies in the past 12 months to be eligible for Age Champion
- No responsibility will be accepted by the Delegate Pony Club or Zone 18 in the case of any accident or damage.
- Program can be changed at the discretion of the Delegate Pony Club committee at any time
- Disputes- A fee of \$50.00 is to be lodged with written disputes presented to the Delegate Pony Club disputes committee within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the particular event. The Delegate Pony Club disputes committee shall comprise of one appointed Delegate Pony Club adult member, the ZCI or appointed representative and the Zone President or appointed representative. The fee may be forfeited if the Delegate Pony Club disputes committee considers the dispute frivolous.
