New Mobile Phone Tower at Bonang lacks back-up

The tallest structure in the district was erected last week on the ridge between Bonang and Bonang West. It is the Telstra mobile phone tower which Tubbut Neighbourhood House and others have been lobbying for over many years. It was approved as part of the rollout of the Federal Government's Mobile Phone Black Spot program three years ago.

"Its been a long process but now the progress is there for all to see. Lack of communications is a major problem in this isolated area which became starkly obvious during the fires of January-February in 2014," said Deb Foskev.

"The landlines can be out for days or weeks, as they were then. Ironically, Telstra sent out mobile phones to local residents, apparently unaware that they wouldn't work up here.

"The mobile phone tower itself is vulnerable in case of fire, as it relies on electricity delivered via wooden poles. For this reason, the community was disappointed to hear that the batteries to be installed will only provide eight hours back-up.

"The reason our landlines went out in 2014 was that the power went down and battery back-up time was limited. We are pleased that Telstra responded to community concern and increased battery back-up at the exchange to ensure that in power failure, it will operate for longer.

"Our community thinks it makes sense to solve this problem while the mobile tower is still under construction by increasing battery capacity and setting up a solar array to ensure the batteries will be able to sustain the tower when power fails due to snowfall, lighting strikes and fire.

"However, Telstra says it can't vary its standard package and 8 hours back-up is standard. Isolated rural communities have non-standard needs and the solution offered, to helicopter in a generator in times of emergency, seems unnecessarily difficult and expensive to us, especially if the blackout occurs in the afternoon or evening, when service providers are often unrespon-

"We are pleased that our local federal member, Darren Chester, has taken up this issue with Telstra on our behalf as other communities are bound to encounter the same problem," said Deb Foskey.

Bailey's Chocolate Coffee Cake



For St Patrick's Day 17th March 2018 Try this beauty.. Ingredients
Cooking spray, for pan

FOR THE FILLING

1 c. brown sugar

1 tbsp. cocoa powder

1 tsp. instant espresso powder

FOR THE CAKE

3/4 c. (1 1/2 sticks) butter, softened to room temperature

1 1/2 c. sugar

1/3 c. brown sugar

2 tsp. baking powder

3 large eggs

2/3 c. sour cream

1 c. whole milk

1/4 c. Baileys

3 c. all-purpose flour

FOR THE TOPPING

1 c. sugar

1 c. all-purpose flour

1 tbsp. cocoa powder

1 tsp. instant espresso powder

pinch of kosher salt

6 tbsp. butter, melted

1/2 c. chocolate chips, melted

Directions

Preheat oven to 350° and grease a 9"x13" pan with cooking spray. Make filling: In a medium bowl, combine brown sugar, cocoa powder and instant espresso powder. Whisk to combine.

Make cake batter: In a large bowl, combine butter, sugars and baking powder. Using a hand mixer, beat until smooth. Next, beat in eggs one at a time.

Add sour cream, whole milk, and Baileys and mix again, until just combined. Gradually beat in flour.

Pour half the batter into prepared baking dish, sprinkle with filling in an even layer, and top with the rest of the batter.

Make topping: In a medium bowl, combine sugar, flour, cocoa powder, espresso powder and a pinch of salt. Whisk to combine. Add melted butter and stir until well combined.

Scatter topping over the top of the coffee cake batter in an even layer. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.

Drizzle with melted chocolate and let cool for 10 to 15 minutes. Slice and serve.
