The fishing competition starts of Friday 11th at 12 noon. Weigh in takes place at 12 noon on Saturday. Followed by trophy presentations.




The car fridge raffle will be drawn and there will be meat and sea food trays plus pick of the table raffles.

Recipe of the Month

Easy sweet potato and crumbed chicken salad



Ingredients

- 800g gold sweet potato, cut crossways into rounds
- 1/4 cup (60ml) olive oil
- 1 teaspoon fennel seeds
- 1 tablespoon rosemary leaves
- 400g packet Chicken Breast Fingers
- 1/4 cup (35g) dried cranberries
- 1/4 cup (40g) pine nuts, toasted
- 60g packet Australian Baby Rocket
- 1 tablespoon olive oil, extra, to serve
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200C. Line a large baking tray with baking paper. Arrange the sweet potato in a single layer on the lined tray. Drizzle with oil. Sprinkle with fennel and rosemary. Cook for 30 mins. Add the chicken to the tray. Cook for 10 mins or until sweet potato is tender and chicken is cooked through.

Step 2

Meanwhile, place the cranberries in a bowl and pour over enough cold water to cover. Set aside for 10 mins to soak. Drain.

Step 3

Arrange the sweet potato, chicken and rocket on a serving platter. Sprinkle with the cranberries and pine nuts. Combine oil and vinegar in a small bowl. Drizzle over the salad to serve.
