Recipes of the Month



Scalloped Potatoes with Bacon (Microwave)

500 grams Potatoes, thinly sliced
4 Bacon Rashers, chopped
300 grams Sour Cream
1 Cup grated Tasty Cheese
3 Green Shallots, chopped

- 1) Place potato slices evenly into shallow dish with water, cover and cook on high for 10 minutes until tender, drain off water.
- 2) Combine bacon and shallots in a small dish, cover and cook on high for 2 minutes.
- 3) Spread sour cream over potatoes, top with bacon/shallot mixture and cheese.
- 4) Cook on high for five minutes or until heated through and cheese is melted.

Serve and enjoy.

Spicy Chicken

6 Chicken Breasts
250 gram Can of Crushed Pineapple
1 tsp English Mustard
1/2 Cup of Chutney
1 Cup sliced Blanched Almonds

- Mix all ingredients together and spoon over Chicken Breasts in roasting tray.
- Bake at 170 degrees C until tender and glazed (Approximately 3/4 to 1 hour of cooking required)
