We were contacted recently by Margaret Lock requesting information on a meteorite that fell in the vicinity of the township of Bendock in 1898. Apparently the object weighing 27 kg was found in Bendock Victoria Australia in 1898 was a Pallasite meteorite and is 1 of 46 approved meteorites classified as Pallasite the co-ordinates recorded were 37 degrees 9'S, 148 degrees 55'E. Meteorite name is Bendock and is 1 of 16 approved meteorites from Victoria Australia. Margaret Lock is the Secretary of the Murchison and District Historical Society Inc.

Another year is almost at an end, and with that comes the annual **Bombala Historical Engines and Machinery Society Rally** being held this year **Nov 9th, 10th, and 11th** at their area at the old railway grounds just up from Lavender House in Bombala. As I have grown up involved with the timber industry, I have no problem with removal of trees for a good needed use.

Also if trees are a danger to the public, it's understandable to have them removed. They should be removed.

But the removal of trees on the left side of the road going down the hill into Bendoc I feel was unnecessary. Many people in the community are dismayed and disappointed and wonder why everyone was not consulted. The windrow could have been removed by hand.

Sweat equity does still exist with some folk. Machine use could have been minimal or not at all. The trees were within their rights to stay. As they say, some people cannot see the forest for the trees.

In this case there is a few who cannot see the natural beauty and the benefits of that beauty to their surrounds and the benefits to society.

Bendoc is a unique town in Australia with it's natural wildlife and forest environment and is certainly amongst the minority with it's natural surroundings. Bendoc is a bush town, not a satellite suburb or a beach side town. It needs to be taken on it's own terms and protected. Bendoc is not Orbost, Delegate or Bombala. Bendoc has it's own identity. If Bendoc is to remain a true individual more consultation should be taken, common sense must feature and prevail. I'm certainly not alone in the disappointing lack of thought, care or consultation. Nobody wants their name on the end of a letter like this, unfortunately I was nominated. Trees offer shade, oxygen, life in general and stop erosion. The removal of the above mentioned trees is a blight on us all. It says we are not thinking, we are losing our pride and we don't care about our history or our heritage.
