Classic Chocolate Rum Balls

Ingredients

- 250g milk chocolate biscuits
- 1 cup sweetened condensed milk
- 1 1/2 cups fine desiccated coconut, extra for coating
- 1/2 cup cocoa powder, extra for coating
- 2tbs dark rum
- 100g chocolate sprinkles, for coating

Method

- 1. Place biscuits in a food processor and process to make fine crumbs (or crush well in a large zip lock bag with a rolling pin). Transfer crumbs to a mixing bowl. Using a wooden spoon, stir in condensed milk, coconut, cocoa and rum and mix until well combined.
- 2. Refrigerate for 1 hour or until cold and firm.
- 3. Using damp hands, roll level tablespoons of mixture into balls.
- 4. Toss rum balls in your choice of extra coconut, extra cocoa or chocolate sprinkles. Refrigerate in an airtight container for up to 1 week.
- Tip: for a kids' version replace dark rum with 2 tsp of vanilla extract and reduce cocoa to 1/3 cup.
