So....... Another eventful month for Bendoc, COVID has magnified many of the issues that border communities have been raising for years, namely communication between the states (heaven forbid) and the isolation Bendoc experiences from the rest of the Victoria. Confusion ensued as a result of the sudden implementation of the border closure between Victoria and NSW. Many locals voiced their concern at the thought of having to leave the relative safety of Bendoc and travel south into potential danger as reports emerged of active cases in Orbost, not to mention the added worry of navigating the Orbost Road unnecessarily. Luckily, restrictions were amended and Bendoc residents are now able to travel to Delegate and Bombala for essential supplies and services. A permit is required for all travel from Victoria into NSW, with a number of categories available. Permits are available to undertake essential services such as agriculture and education, students are permitted to attend school across the border, and individuals are allowed travel to receive medical care as long as they can provide proof of the care they are to receive. The Bendoc Resource Centre has been available to assist people with the permit application process and we extend the offer to all locals who potentially may not have access to phone, internet, or printing services, or who simply wish to talk to someone about their

concerns. Please feel free to call in and we should be able to help you with your

permits.


I have been working in the 'community' sector as a Social Planner/ Place Maker for 25 years in a range of locations across south east Queensland, the ACT and Victoria - from highly disadvantaged locations such as the Logan and Ipswich shires outside Brisbane, to the 'salad bowl' farming communities of the Lockyer Valley west of Brisbane to the relative affluence of the Sunshine Coast. More recently I have been working in Victoria's Latrobe Valley.

For these roles I have worked across aged care, migrant settlement, mental health and disability support for local government, federal government, not-for-profits and peak bodies.

I did the sea-change/ tree-change from Melbourne to the Gippsland Lakes four years ago which was like 'coming home' after spending many happy holidays here as a kid and visiting family and friends in between.

\$ 5 bag (minimum charge)

\$11 up to 250 litre (large wheelie bin)

\$46 per cubic metre (approx. 6x4 trailer x 1.5 feet deep)

Domestic Recyclables - must be loose, can be transported in a bag but must be emptied into tip cage/bin

- \$ 1 bag size (minimum charge)
- \$ 2 up to 250 litre (large wheelie bin)
- \$ 8 per cubic metre (approx. 6x4 trailer x 1.5 feet deep)

Green waste - tree prunings, branches or grass clippings, BUT, no logs larger than 30cm diameter) Free

Scrap Metal - fencing wire, clean of wooden posts and vegetation. Roofing, guttering, white goods (only fridges or freezers that have already lost their refrigerant gasses)
Free

Mattresses - generally not accepted. However, if the inner metal springs are removed and the fabric covering rolled up and tied up tightly, they can be disposed of as scrap metal (free) and waste (charged by volume)

Polystyrene - charged as waste (by volume)

BUT the Bendoc TIP is currently taking polystyrene and sending it to Bairnsdale Tip, to be part-processed (to have the air crushed out of it) for forwarding on for further processing.

Small household batteries, no larger than a D cell battery - Jim is happy to collect and take to AL-DI for disposal in their special battery recycling bin. (Best way is to put loose batteries in a plastic bag. They have to be loose to go through a 2-inch diameter hole in the ALDI's bin)

Soft plastics (plastic bags, bread bags, soft frozen food bags etc. - Jim is also happy to collect and take to Woolworths and Coles for disposal in their special soft plastic recycling bins. (Best way is to stuff and pack all your plastic bags tightly into a long bread bag and tie a knot in the end) then drop off to Jim at the tip.

BENDOC POLICE NEWS

Hi All,

Welcome to the second edition of Police News for Bendoc and surrounding areas. Orbost Police remain committed to providing a policing service within the Bendoc area, including the opening of the police station where community members can attend for document signing and other police related business. Our intention is to keep the community informed on what is happening in their local area and to ensure you are aware of police attendance and patrols.

Recent Events:

Police have attended Bendoc and surrounding areas over the past month on a weekly basis and are pleased with the community interaction. We continue to get calls from community in relation to Illegal deer hunters and encourage you to please continue reporting.

Since 2015 Victoria Police have implemented targeted operations to tackle the increasing trend of illegal hunting / shooting within East Gippsland, predominantly within the Orbost, Bendoc, Cann River and Omeo areas. The 2019 operation achieved record outcomes, with over 21 firearms seized and 12 persons charged with offences connected with illegal hunting activities and associated drink / drug driving offences. The 2020 operation commenced on the 1st June and whilst in its infancy, has already achieved excellent results which were printed in the last newsletter. This operation sees Victoria Police coordinate patrols with the Game Management Authority, Parks Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning to ensure a vast range of enforcement options are implemented.

Unfortunately, these illegal and unsafe shooting activities present significant safety risks to residents and also impact on hunters that abide by the laws and regulations through the reluctance of land holders to allow legitimate hunters onto their properties.

New Speed Limit For Darragh



Speed limit reductions for Mount Darragh Road between South Pambula and Cathcart.

Transport for NSW will be reducing the speed limit on sections of Mount Darragh Road between South Pambula and Cathcart on 16 June 2020.

What are we doing?

Adjustments are being made to speed limits along Mount Darragh road following community concerns and an increase in accidents in the area.

A speed zone review assessed several factors including the crash history, road alignment, road environment and hazards,) road usage, adjacent development, traffic volumes and the number of access points along the road.

Speed reductions include:


- Reduce 100km/h to 80km/h from South Pambula to Chalk Hills Road
- Reduce 100km/h to 60km/h from Chalk Hills Road to 4km west of Chalk Hills Road
- Reduce 100km/h to 80km/h between 4km west of Chalk Hills Road to 320m east of Clarke Street, Wyndham
- Reduce 100km/h to 80km/h from West Street to 1.5km west of New Buildings Road, Wyndham
- Reduce 100km/h to 60km/h from 1.5km west of New Buildings Road to 900m west of Stoves Road, Mount Darragh

The image on the back page highlights the various adjustments being made being made.

What you need to know

You will see over the coming weeks crews out preparing for the speed limit changes on the 16th June. While these crews are working, for the safety of motorists and workers, a single lane closure, traffic control and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place.




