Plan now for winter firewood needs

Firewood collectors across north east Victoria are being urged to start planning their winter firewood needs as part of the opening of the spring collection season.

From September 1, designated firewood collection areas will open across Victoria, allowing communities to gather wood for personal use.

All firewood collection activities must comply with public health measures, prioritising the safety of the Victorian community.

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) Gippsland Deputy Chief Fire Officer, Bethany Roberts said: "We are anticipating an increased demand for firewood during the spring and autumn collection seasons."

"Due to a range of impacts, including last summer's bushfires, we are anticipating that demand will exceed supply in some areas of the region." Mrs Roberts said.

"We are urging people who rely on firewood for heating and cooking to consider all options, including purchasing firewood from local merchants selling legally obtained wood.

"In fire affected communities, we are continuing to look for opportunities to provide alternative collection areas and restrict access to residents of certain post codes or local government areas.

"We want to remind the community that firewood can only be taken from designated collection areas in state forests or parks during approved collection seasons.

"Designated collection areas are selected for a range of reasons including the availability of firewood, community safety, and to protect sites of cultural and environmental significance.

"Firewood collected from public land is for personal use only and cannot be sold.

"It's important to stay within collection limits, which are in place to prevent households stockpiling large volumes of firewood from public land and denying others a supply.

"Collection limits include taking a maximum of two cubic metres per person per day and a maximum of 16 cubic metres per household per financial year.

"The felling of trees and cutting of hollow logs for firewood is also prohibited. Hollow logs and dead trees provide critical habitat for a wide variety of native species."

Firewood collection from roadsides is managed by local government agencies and usually requires a permit. Residents are encouraged to contact their local councils directly for further details.

Authorised officers patrol parks, forests and reserves to ensure people are doing the right thing.

Welcome to the September edition of Police News for Bendoc and surrounding areas.

Looks like stage 3 restrictions will be with us a bit longer than expected.

I would like to reiterate the importance of looking after each other in these challenging times and encourage anyone who is feeling anxious or over whelmed, to reach out and talk to someone or phone mental health services such as Life Line (13 11 14) or Beyond Blue (1300 22 4636).

<u>Current Events:</u> In late September, we will be commencing works on the residence behind the police station. Once completed, this will allow members to stay over night for operations and emergency response situations such as wild fires. In time, we hope to have units attend Bendoc and surrounding areas on a more regular basis allowing us to conduct more patrols in bushland and hunting hot spots. Thank you to those community members who keep us informed of the illegal hunting in the area. This assists us with our intel for upcoming operations.

Police continue to visit Bendoc on a weekly basis and encourage community to contact the member at the station or call Police if they require assistance.

While COVID may change the way we provide services, it will never change our total commitment to provide those services to our community through whatever means possible.

Our 'safe operation' mode keeps services available and keeps the community safe.

Eleni has offered to organise services such as Royal Flying Doctor Psychologist, Rural financial counselling service, legal service and/or Anglicare financial counselling for those interested. 


