Hi All,

Welcome to the October edition of Police News for Bendoc and surrounding areas. Great to see some of the restrictions being lifted for us regional folk think we will be wearing masks for a little longer though...

Well our renos at the station residence are almost completed and looking great. The accommodation will enable police to stay in Bendoc overnight. We are very excited to be offering the Bendoc community a greater police presence over the coming months and are hoping once Covid restrictions are lifted, we can hold a community meeting for residents and police to catch up and discuss local issues/concerns. The old house directly next door will be demolished in the coming months to pave way for more parking for police and emergency services vehicles visiting the area.

Current Events:

Local police conducted 2 operations in October targeting illegal deer hunting in the Bendoc/Bonang areas. Police spoke with several campers all from Victoria and were happy that no offences were detected on either occasion. Police did not locate any illegal hunters but will continue to conduct random operations through out the coming months. Thank you to those community members who keep us informed of the illegal hunting in the area. This assists us with our intel for upcoming operations.

Police continue to visit Bendoc on a weekly basis and encourage community to contact the member at the station or call Police if they require assistance.
