## FIRE RESTRICTIONS TO END IN EAST GIPPSLAND SHIRE

The Fire Danger Period (FDP) will finish at 1.00am on Monday, 15 April in East Gippsland. While restrictions are lifting in this area, CFA still expects the grassfire risk to remain across the state, so you need to remain alert and prepared.

Residents are reminded that Total Fire Ban days may still occur so any fires that are lit must be able to be extinguished immediately.

The end of the Fire Danger Period (FDP) will be an opportunity for some landowners to burn-off again, however it's important that residents check that local conditions are safe before undertaking these activities.

You must register your burn-offs, check weather conditions and follow local council laws, as well as EPA laws and applicable regulations.

Registering your burn-off ensures that if smoke or fire is reported, the incident is cross-checked with our register, which prevents firefighters from unnecessarily responding.

When conducting burn-offs, remain alert and always have resources on hand to extinguish the fire.

**Landowners can register their burn-off online at [www.firepermits.vic.gov.au](http://www.firepermits.vic.gov.au) or call 1800 668 511.**

If possible, landowners should also notify their neighbours and others nearby who may be sensitive to smoke so they can take necessary precautions.

**Tips for looking after your health when there is smoke can be found on EPA's website.**

Keep your burn off safe and legal:

Check fire restrictions in your area and always register your burn at [www.firepermits.vic.gov.au](http://www.firepermits.vic.gov.au).

Check and monitor weather conditions – particularly wind.

To avoid unnecessary calls to emergency services, notify your neighbours beforehand.

Leave a three-metre fire break, free from flammable materials around the burn.

Have sufficient equipment and water to stop the fire spreading.

Never leave a burn-off unattended – stay for its entire duration.

If your burn-off gets out of control, call '000' immediately.

### Notification of fox control using 1080 and/or PAPP baits as part of the Southern Ark project

This is a notice advising you that the Department of Environment, Energy and Climate Action (DEECA) will be undertaking an ongoing baiting program on all public land in the **Snowy District**, in the **Colquhoun and Kenny Forests in the Tambo District**, and in the **Red Bluff section of the Lakes Entrance-Lake Tyers Coastal Reserve**, to control **foxes**.

**Foxoff® baits** containing the toxin 1080 (sodium fluoroacetate) or **Foxecute® baits** containing the toxin PAPP (Par-aminopropiophenone) will be used for these programs, and they will be buried at a depth of 15cm below the ground in pre-constructed and maintained bait stations.

#### **TIMING OF THESE PROGRAMS:**

Fox control on all public land (State Forests and National Parks) in the **Snowy District** is continuous from April 17<sup>th</sup> 2024 until October 17<sup>th</sup> 2024.

Fox control on public land (State Forests and National Parks) in the **Kenny and Colquhoun Forests** in the Tambo District will occur from **May 13<sup>th</sup> 2024** and continue until **May 26<sup>th</sup> 2024** (14 days) and from **July 15<sup>th</sup> 2024** and continue until **July 28<sup>th</sup> 2024** (14 days). Outside of these dates, unpoisoned baits will be buried in bait stations in these forests.

Fox control in the **Red Bluff section of the Lakes Entrance-Lake Tyers Coastal Reserve** will continue from **April 17<sup>th</sup> 2024** until **October 17<sup>th</sup> 2024**. Baits will only be placed on the forest tracks in this reserve and NOT along the beach front.

There is no known antidote for 1080 and baits should not be handled by unauthorised people. There is an antidote for PAPP but must be administered by a veterinarian within 30 minutes of bait consumption. Unrestrained pets may be at risk. Please heed all warning signs and keep pets under control to ensure they do not consume baits.

The use of the 1080 and/or PAPP baits will comply with the product label and the *Directions for the Use of 1080 and PAPP Pest Animal Bait Products in Victoria*. When used in accordance with these documents, the risk of humans or animals being poisoned by 1080 or PAPP baits can effectively be managed.

While the scope and complexity of recovery works have been huge, we're committed to ensuring they are carried out safely, while also preserving the unique cultural heritage and environmental values of these special places. ### **Buchan Minji (Buchan Caves Reserve) is back open**

Following the flash flood on Boxing Day 2023, Parks Victoria and Gunaikurnai Aboriginal Land and Waters Corporation undertook an immense program of flood repair works. The reserve is now back open and welcoming visitors once more.

The Mallacoota Visitor Precinct project is progressing with various assessments, including the ecological assessment as part of the Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act approval, now complete.

Newly arrived from Bendoc and the Alpine, Snowy River and Errinundra national parks, Gary Bellesini is our new Ranger Team Leader in Mallacoota. Gary has a 34-year-career with Parks Victoria that has seen him excel in pest plant and animal control, protected area management, fire suppression, controlled burning and compliance. ### **Take a cliff-side walk at Cape Conran Coastal Park**

The spectacular East Cape Boardwalk is now repaired and open following the devastating damage caused during the Black Summer bushfires. Elsewhere in Cape Conran Coastal Park, recovery works are progressing through approvals.

### **Thurra River Bridge early works begin**

Early works have begun on the Thurra River Bridge rebuild project following bushfire and flood damage. Led by the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, the work begins with the appointment of a contractor to demolish the old bridge.
