2 stalks of silver beet or greens - knob of butter 2 eggs - salt, pepper, spices or seeds For flavour, serve with sauerkraut for flavour

20 Figs 1/2 cup brown sugar 3 slices fresh ginger 2 cups water 1 thumbnail length of cinnamon stick

#### GARDE NING BITS WITH BOB

Well we have crossed the line & half of the year is gone. From here on in it's full-on time in the garden. Weeds, mulch and pruning and being careful with new plants and seeds as it's too early to plant out.

When driving around here, have a look, things are changing at the top end of town. I have started to improve things at the Hilton. Big plans for the bush area. First clean it up & get rid of the wattle, lightwood, blackberries & long grass. Planning is underway with Japanese Maples, shaped by large gums, rhododendrons, azaleas, bottlebrush and crepe myrtle as well as native flowering tree shrubs to help with birds, bees & more.

So if you're passing, stop by & say hi, I do not bite & love new ideas and input. I make a good cuppa & have biscuits. My dog Maggie, only bites if she doesn't get a biscuit.

After a lot of reading I feel confident about planting my first 3 tubers. I picked a sunny south facing spot at the front, protected by the wind. I mulched cow & chicken pelletised manures, a bed of leaves, paper, rotted down sawdust and vegetable matter to help worms keep the ground loose. I added lime to bring the PH up to 7–7.5 but if your soil is already alkaline, use gypsum. Not all nurseries still sell soil kits.

#### Roses and Black spot.

Autumn is when black spot will be seen. Roses are often troubled by fungal disease, especially black spot which affects the foliage. To help break the disease cycle, remove the damaged leaves and pick up fallen leaves and burn them.

Spray remaining foliage with a suitable organic fungicide and feed the plant with rose food and liquid potash. Replace mulch as it will contain fungal spores. It can be used elsewhere in the garden.

To help control black spot, mildew & rust

- Water roses in the morning
- To make a natural Fungicide Mix 1 tsp bicarb-soda, 1 drop vegetable oil
- 1 drop of dish detergent in 1 litre of water Spray 3 times leaving 3 weeks between sprays

Lesley Crowed of Kaydale Lodge in Tasmania said "We have never seen an overfed **peony**" They enjoy plenty of lime compost and potash from the open fire. I have held off planting because of the rain & plan to plant on the 19th/6 To those interested, come & have a look & see what's happening.

#### **Feeding**

Around March is the time to feed Azaleas, Camelias & Rhododendrons so they are ready for winter and spring. These plants are acid lovers, so seek out a fertiliser specifically formulated for them.

Pull back mulch from around the base of the plant. Apply fertiliser according to instructions. Water well & replace mulch.

#### **HINTS**

Camelia's love wood mulch, vermicompost, and organic pellets. I apply seaweed solution and molasses 4 times a year, and trace elements before flowering. I have also been experimenting with adding Biochar and fulvic acid.
